

## Colorado Lions Camp

### Health Care & Medication Procedures (REV.1/18 JF)

The Colorado Lions Camp concern for the camper's health and well-being is an integral part of the camper's stay. A Registered Nurse/Licensed Practical Nurse/or QMAP Certified staff is on site 24 hours a day during camp sessions to administer medications, perform routine medical treatments and to ensure the camper's medical needs are being met. In addition, the camp has an on-call physician who approves the Colorado Lions Camp Health Care Plan and Standing Orders annually and serves as an advisor to the Camp Nurse. In the event of medication questions OR if the camper has an accident and needs medical treatment, the Camp Medical Staff will contact the parents/caregiver directly.

#### Health Care Check-In and Check-Out Policies & Procedures

Every camper must meet with the Camp Medical Staff during check-in at the beginning of the camp session. The physical condition of each camper will be screened upon arrival to camp and recorded. The screening will include temperature and heart rate checks, identification of illness or communicable diseases, check-in of medications and discussions of any specific medical treatments the camper will need during their stay, dietary requirements, allergy verification and any physical limitations. The Camp Medical Staff will have the authority to determine whether or not a camper should be allowed to remain at the camp program based upon the camper needs and their physical condition during their camp stay.

#### Medication Preparation for Camp

Please follow these directions when preparing the camper's medications to attend camp. All prescription medications, vitamins & supplements **MUST** be pre-poured **BEFORE** your arrival to camp. This includes topicals, eye drops, etc.

#### How do I prepare my camper's medication for check-in?

All medication, vitamins and supplements must be pre-poured/prepackaged in a med minder box by a pharmacist, parent/caregiver, or agency. See pictures listed below.

Packaged by the pharmacy in bubble packs by time/dosage for **each day**. Please have the pharmacy include all pills together (not separately) for each day/dosage.

Bring the med minder box, the original prescription bottle(s) and/or bubble pack(s) showing the current prescription information, **AND** the **RELEASE OF LIABILITY FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF PRE-POURED MEDICATIONS FORM** signed by the caregiver/parent/agency who pre-poured the medication. Each bottle needs to contain one pill inside for verification purposes - this includes vitamin and homeopathic supplements prescribed by a physician. All medications **MUST** match the approved medication list provided by the physician signed Medical Physical Examination Form and must be current at the time of check-in. Any medications changes must be addressed **PRIOR** to their arrival to camp.
